

"For creation was subjected to futility, not by its own will, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in the hope that even creation itself will be set free...to share in the glorious freedom of the children of God." ~ Romans 8:20-21

PASTOR'S MESSAGE: "Brrrrrr!"

Walking in the post office someone asked, "Who ordered this cold weather anyway!"

"Wasn't my idea!" I replied.

In Romans 8:20 it's clear this extreme cold wasn't the creation's idea either! It was subjected, "Not by its own will," the apostle says, "but by the will of the one who subjected it."

When it says, "subjected to futility" the point is that creation can no longer attain the purpose intended for it by the Creator. God originally fashioned the world for our happiness and enjoyment. But when sin entered the world, that purpose could no longer be fully realized. Cold weather's just one example of that. We're at the mercy of the creation and can't control what it does. A meteorologist can predict it. He can explain it with terms like "arctic air" or "polar vortex," but we have no power over it. We bundle up head to toe to avoid exposure. We crank up the furnace in our homes (Thank God for fossil fuels!)

Bottom line: people dream about overcoming the effects of sin by working together toward common goals to bring more prosperity, peace, and harmony to the people of the earth. But just about the time modest progress is made, the presence of sin in every person frustrates that progress at every turn it seems.

In the verse above Paul teaches us why God "subjected" things like bitter cold on the creation. He did this "in the hope" that we in our mad pursuit of worldly happiness, might stop and look instead to Him real hope and a better future in Christ His Son. Even the creation appears to look to God's promise of a future hope that's anchored in the redeeming work of Christ Jesus our Lord. Jesus came to undo the ruin Satan brought into this world by leading Adam and Eve into sin. His death and resurrection not only sets us free from sin and death; it motivates us to extend the same promise of hope and new life to our neighbor, so that we can have heaven *in heaven* some day.

No, we don't have any control over the creation; nor are we able to undo all the other far-reaching effects of sin either, including death, the worst effect of all, but we do have full deliverance from all this in Christ! No matter how cold it is outside, God's love in Christ warms our hearts and gives us an eternal source of hope and joy!



- Currently \$100K has been collected or pledged toward the *Let the Children Come* debt retirement goal payment of \$475K that will be due every November 1 until 2038. Gifts to meet this goal are always needed and appreciated.
- Donors participating in the *\$66 for 66 Years Legacy Project* continue to support the growth of the FVL Foundation and its focus of tuition assistance.

FVL PRINCIPAL'S REPORT TO THE FEDERATION - NOV 2018

<u>**FVL MISSION**</u>: Partners with families and Federation churches, providing students with a Christ-centered education preparing teens for lives of service and for eternity.

SCHOOL NEWS

- The second semester began with 648 students. (Last year was 615 students.)
- Currently, 150 eighth graders have indicated that they will attend FVL next year. Another 50 are still undecided. The Class of 2023 will replace our graduating senior class of 148.
- The application window for the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP) opens on February 1 and closes April 20. WPCP offers families the chance to have their student's FVL tuition fully funded for all four years! Go to fvlhs.org to find easy-to-read eligibility charts. Also this year FVL's Tuition Assistance program application window will be the same (from February 1 April 20). Those who don't qualify for WPCP can apply to this program if there is a financial need.
- Parents interested in enrolling 8th graders for 2019-20 should complete the online registration form at fvlhs.org. They will receive a link to sign up for sessions on 2/27 or to choose a different date.
- Host families are needed for FVL's international program for next school year. Interested parents should contact Monica Uhlenbrauck at <u>muhlenbrauck@fvlhs.org</u>.

An expression of faith from one of our youth...

Students from the Grade 7-8 Catechism class were asked to write a paragraph including the following thoughts: (1) What does it mean to you that Jesus died to give you eternal life and (2) what you think you'll be doing five years from now to serve and thank Jesus for his forgiveness. Here's what one of our students (Olivia Peters) submitted...

It means , a lot that Jesus died for our sins and eternal life because if he woudn't have died for our sins and eternan life we would not be going to heavan. In 5 years from now I will be going to church and thank him for the things he has done for me and my family

Our confirmation students just finished

studying about the Person and Work of Jesus Christ, and are beginning to study about the Holy Spirit's work of creating faith in our hearts through the Means of Grace in Word and sacrament.

They learned about the most important teaching in the Bible ("Justification") the teaching that all sinners are declared forgiven and holy in God's sight because of Christ's finished work on the cross.

Their next lesson asks the question: "What role do good works play in a Christian's life?" Most religions of the world and even many Christian denominations answer this question wrong. The Bible teaches that good works flow form a heart of faith in Jesus and that they are the way we show our thanks to God for his forgiveness. They are not the reason we are forgiven. They are the joy-filled response to God's free gift of forgiveness and salvation +


ST PAUL LIBRARY - UPDATE
