PROPERTY REPAIR & IMPROVEMENT COSTS



The council was directed from the January Quarterly Meeting to get quotes on repair & improvement projects. Below is a list of projects & their cost. Please review this so we can decide what we want to do and discuss how to fund them. This will be on the agenda at the Quarterly Meeting on April 28, 2019.

- 1. Replacing the Roof on the North Entryway. The project would have the old Porch Roof removed and replace it with a Steel Roof and an 18" overhang. The cost would be \$4,720. This is a repair project that needs attention.
- 2. Fix the Southwest Door. The framework around the steel door frame is rotten and needs to be replaced. The cost would be \$2,870. When doing this project we will also look at the studs in the west exterior wall. If further work is needed it would be a separate project.
- 3. Painting the Interior of the Church. This project would include fixing the cracked plaster in the balcony and the walls in the church. Then priming where needed and painting the walls and balcony. The cost of this project is \$4,200 for plaster repair. \$2,700.40 for Painting the Balcony. \$3,215.80 for Painting the main level of the church. \$400 for renting a lift. Total cost \$10,516.20. We can break this into two projects. Paint the Balcony or Paint the main level.
- 4. Adding a Restroom in the Entryway of the Church. The restroom would go where the coatroom is presently. This project would require a lift pump that would be located in old Pioneer Room in the basement and then run plumbing to the drain in the Kitchen. This project would also require the members of the Church to strip the coatroom to the studs. The Carpentry work, Electrical work and finish Carpentry work would cost \$5,450.00. The Plumbing work would cost \$5,400.00. \$100 for permits. Total cost would be \$10,900.00
