Second Day

<u>Reader</u>: And God said, "Let there be a vault to divide the water and keep it in two separate places." And it was so. God made a vault, and it separated the water under it from the water above it. He named the vault, "Sky." Evening passed and morning came—the second day.

Old Testament Reading.....from Isaiah 55 Come, all you who are thirsty, come to the waters; and you that have no money, come, buy and eat! ... Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live ... Seek the Lord while he may be found, call upon him while he is near. Let the wicked forsake their way, and the unrighteous their thoughts; let them return to the Lord, that he may have mercy on them, and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon...For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, declares the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts. For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return there until they have watered the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and succeed in the thing for which I sent it.

<u>Reader</u>: And God said, "Let there be lights in the sky to give light upon the earth, to be for signs and seasons and days and years." And it was so. And God saw that it was good. Evening passed and morning came—the fourth day.

New Testament Reading.....1 Corinthians 15

Someone will ask, "How can the dead be raised to life? What kind of body will they have?" How foolish! When you plant a seed in the ground, it does not sprout to life unless it dies. And what you plant is just a seed, perhaps a grain of wheat or some other grain, not the fullbodied plant that will later grow up. But God provides that seed with a body as he wishes; he gives each seed its own proper body...And there are heavenly bodies and earthly bodies; the beauty that belongs to heavenly bodies is different from the beauty that belongs to earthly bodies. The sun has its own beauty, the moon another beauty, and the stars a different beauty; and even among stars there are different kinds of beauty. So it will be when the dead are raise to life. When the body is buried, it is mortal; when raised it will be immortal. When buried, it is ugly and weak; when raised, it will be beautiful and strong ...For when the trumpet sounds, the dead will be raised, never to die again, and we shall all be changed! Thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!

The Fifth Day

<u>Reader</u>: And God said, "Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the heavens." And God saw that it was good. Evening passed and morning came—the fifth day.

The Gospel Reading...... Matthew 6:25-33 Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? Therefore do not be anxious, saying, "What shall we eat?" or "What shall we drink?" or "What shall we wear?" For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.
