THE FIRST SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD January 14, 2018

AS WE GATHER

This day in the Church marks the beginning of the season of Epiphany. The white paraments in Church today call to mind the purity of Christ whose Baptism we remember today. The rest of the Sundays in Epiphany the color will be green, focusing on the growth and new life the Church has through Christ. The readings in the Epiphany season will take us along as Jesus begins his earthly ministry that eventually takes us to Calvary. The next season in the church is Lent (*Ash Wednesday will be on Wednesday, February 14, 2018 - 6:30 pm*).

THE WORD

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: Isaiah 49:1-6 *Even though few would recognize or see it's worth, the Messiah's work will be blessed by the Father.* "Listen to me, you islands; hear this, you distant nations: Before I was born the LORD called me; from my mother's womb he has spoken my name. ²He made my mouth like a sharpened sword, in the shadow of his hand he hid me; he made me into a polished arrow and concealed me in his quiver. ³He said to me, "You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will display my splendor." ⁴But I said, "I have labored in vain; I have spent my strength for nothing at all. Yet what is due me is in the LORD's hand, and my reward is with my God."

VERSE OF THE DAY "Alleluia. *"You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."* Alleluia. (Mark 1:11)



EPISTLE LESSON: Acts 16:25-34 - *Salvation is not a matter of doing, but believing in what Jesus, our Savior, came to do for us.* About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them. ²⁶Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken. At once all the prison doors flew open, and everyone's chains came loose. ²⁷The jailer woke up, and when he saw the prison doors open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself because he thought the prisoners had escaped. ²⁸But Paul shouted, "Don't harm yourself! We are all here!" ²⁹The jailer called for lights, rushed in and fell trembling before Paul and Silas. ³⁰He then brought them out and asked, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" ³¹They replied, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved—you and your household." ³²Then they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all the others in his house. ³³At that hour of the night the jailer took them and washed their wounds; then immediately he and all his household were baptized. ³⁴The jailer brought them into his house and set a meal before them; he was filled with joy because he had come to believe in God—he and his whole household.

APOSTOLIC GREETING

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with you all.

C: And also with you.

THE GOSPEL LESSON: Mark 1:4-11 ~ *Jesus is baptized by John, setting him apart on the world stage as our Substitute and Savior.* ⁴And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵The whole Judean country-side and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River. ⁶John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷And this was his message: "After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." ⁹At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰Just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. ¹¹And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."

BAPTISMAL REMEMBRANCE & CONFESSION

P: Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, by the power of the Word the Holy Spirit has led you to believe that new life is yours through in Christ Jesus our Lord. By your Baptism the Lord Jesus assures you of your salvation. As a public testimony of your faith, I now ask you: Do you believe that you were born in sin and therefore eternally lost?

C: Yes, I believe.

P: Do you believe in the Triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit?

C: Yes, I believe.

P: Do you believe that this Triune God planned and carried out your salvation, delivering you from the clutches of Satan and the power of your own sinful nature?

C: Yes, I believe.

P: Do you believe that God connects you to the saving work of Jesus and grants you forgiveness of sins, life and salvation in Holy Baptism?

C: Yes, I believe, and God's grace in my baptism leaves me eternally grateful and ready to thank him with a life devoted to him.

P: Receive the sign of the cross to mark you as a redeemed child of God. You have been baptized into Christ, you were born again and made a dear child of your Father in heaven. May God give you the strength to live in your baptismal grace all the days of your life.

C: And al - so with you.


