

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON: 1 KINGS 17:7-16 (The Word of the LORD is carried by the prophet Elijah to the widow at Zarephath. Jesus will cite this as proof that the gospel will go outside Israel to the Gentiles when it rejects the Anointed One). "Some time later the brook dried up because there had been no rain in the land.⁸Then the word of the LORD came to him: ⁹ "Go at once to Zarephath in the region of Sidon and stay there. I have directed a widowthere to supply you with food." ¹⁰ So he went to Zarephath. When he came to the town gate, a widow was there gathering sticks. He called to her and asked, "Would you bring me a little water in a jar so I may have a drink?"¹¹ As she was going to get it, he called, "And bring me, please, a piece of bread." ¹² "As surely as the LORD your God lives," she replied, "I don't have any bread—only a handful of flour in a jar and a little olive oil in a jug. I am gathering a few sticks to take home and make a meal for myself and my son, that we may eat it—and die." ¹³ Elijah said to her, "Don't be afraid. Go home and do as you have said. But first make a small loaf of bread for me from what you have and bring it to me, and then make something for vourself and your son.¹⁴ For this is

what the LORD, the God of Israel, says: 'The jar of flour will not be used up and the jug of oil will not run dry until the day the LORD sends rain on the land.'" ¹⁵ She went away and did as Elijah had told her. So there was food every day for Elijah and for the woman and her family. ¹⁶ For the jar of flour was not used up and the jug of oil did not run dry, in keeping with the word of the LORD spoken by Elijah."

THE PSALM OF THE DAY: Ps.78, page 95 (Sing Responsively)

SECOND LESSON: ROMANS 10:18-11:6 - F. "But I ask: Did they not hear? Of course they did: "Their voice has gone out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world." ¹⁹ Again I ask Did Israel not understand? First, Moses says, "I will make you envious by those who are not a nation; I will make you angry by a nation that has no understanding." ²⁰ And Isaiah boldly says, "I was found by those who did not seek me; I revealed myself to those who did not ask for me."²¹ But concerning Israel he says, "All day long I have held out my hands to a disobedient and obstinate people." 11^{:1} I ask then: Did God reject his people? By no means! I am an Israelite myself, a descendant of Abraham, from the tribe of Benjamin.² God did not reject his people, whom he foreknew. Don't you know what Scripture says in the passage about Elijah—how he appealed to God against Israel: ³ "Lord, they have killed your prophets and torn down your altars; I am the only one left, and they are trying to kill me"?⁴And what was God's answer to him? "I have reserved for myself seven thousand who have not bowed the knee to Baal." ⁵ So too, at the present time there is a remnant chosen by grace. ⁶And if by grace, then it cannot be based on works; if it were, grace would no longer be grace.

VERSE OF THE DAY: Alleluia! "The Spirit of the Lord is on me; he has anointed me to preach good news." Alleluia! (Luke 4:18)

THE GOSPEL LESSON: LUKE 4:20-32 (In unbelief the people of Jesus' own hometown attempt to murder him, but he passes through the angry mob to continue his mission and reveal himself in Capernaum).²⁰ "He rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him.²¹ He began to tell them, "Today, this Scripture is

fulfilled in your hearing."²² They all spoke well of him and were impressed by the words of grace that came from his mouth. And they kept saving, "Isn't this Joseph's son?"²³He told them, "Certainly you will quote this proverb to me, 'Physician, heal yourself!' Do here in your hometown everything we heard you did in Capernaum."²⁴ And he said, "Amen I tell you: No prophet is accepted in his hometown.²⁵ But truly I tell you: There were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah, when the sky was shut for three years and six months, while a great famine came over all the land. ²⁶ Elijah was not sent to any of them, but to a widow of Zarephath, in Sidon.²⁷ And there were many lepers in Israel in the time of Elisha the prophet, yet not one of them was healed except Naaman the Syrian." ²⁸ All those who were in the synagogue were filled with rage when they heard these things.²⁹ They got up and drove him out of the town. They led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, in order to throw him off the cliff. ³⁰ But he passed through the middle of them and went on his way. ³¹He went down to Capernaum, a town of Galilee, and was teaching them on the Sabbath. 3^{2} They were amazed by his teaching, because his message had authority.
