

AS WE GATHER

Note the words in our Order of Service for the Sacrament today that speak of Christ as the One, "who brought the gift of salvation to all people by his death on the tree of the cross, so that the devil who overcame us by a tree would in turn by a tree be overcome."

The opening hymn also reminds us of the deep significance the cross holds for us. Then, too, did you know that the cross in our sanctuary today was cut from our 2018 Christmas tree. The evergreen is often a symbol of life. Scripture calls Jesus the "Prince of Life." (Acts 3:15) He is "the way and the truth and the life." (Jn.14:6) In the season of Lent we see this "Tree of Life" cut down while He was yet green and full of life (Luke 23:31) And Scripture tells us why: "He has appeared once for all at the culmination of the ages to do away with sin by the sacrifice of himself." (Heb.9:26)

Indeed, "Sweet the moments, rich in blessing, which before the cross we spend." ~ CW #111:1

THE LESSONS

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: Deuteronomy 26:5-10

Then you shall declare before the LORD your God: "My father was a wandering Aramean, and he went down into Egypt with a few people and lived there and became a great nation, powerful and numerous. ⁶ But the Egyptians mistreated us and made us suffer, subjecting us to harsh labor. ⁷ Then we cried out to the LORD, the God of our ancestors, and the LORD heard our voice and saw our misery, toil and oppression. ⁸ So the LORD brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with great terror and with signs and wonders. ⁹ He brought us to this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey; ¹⁰ and now I bring the firstfruits of the soil that you, LORD, have given me." Place the basket before the LORD your God and bow down before him.

PSALM OF THE DAY: Ps.91, page 100 (Sing in Unison)

SECOND LESSON: Hebrews 4:14-16

Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has ascended into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. ¹⁵ For we do not have a high priest who is unable to

empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin. ¹⁶Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need.

<u>VERSE OF THE DAY:</u> "It is written. 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only.'" (Matthew 4:10)

THE GOSPEL LESSON: Luke 4:1-13

Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, ² where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them he was hungry. ³ The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread." ⁴ Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone." ⁵ The devil led him up to a high place and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. ⁶ And he said to him, "I will give you all their authority and splendor; it has been given to me, and I can give it to anyone I want to. ⁷ If you worship me, it will all be yours." ⁸ Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Worship the Lord your God and serve him only." ⁹ The devil led him to Jerusalem and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. "If you are the Son of God," he said, "throw yourself down from here. ¹⁰ For it is written: "He will command his angels concerning you to guard you carefully; ¹¹ they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone." 12 Jesus answered, "It is said: 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test."" ¹³ When the devil had finished all this tempting, he left him until an opportune time.
