

FIRST LESSON: Jeremiah 23:1-6 - God tends his church through shepherds who are faithful to his Word. THE GOSPEL LESSON: MARK 6:30-34



While taking time to deepen the faith of his disciples, Jesus shows that love for God's pure Word and compassion for souls go hand in hand. The apostles gathered around Jesus and reported to him all they had done and taught. ³¹ Then, because so many people were coming and going that they did not even have a chance to eat, he said to them, "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest." ³² So they went away by themselves in a boat to a solitary place. ³³ But many who saw them leaving recognized them and ran on foot from all the towns and got there ahead of them. ³⁴ When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. So he began teaching them many things.

SERMON SERIES ON EPHESIANS: "IN CHRIST"




TODAY: "<u>Connected</u>, In Christ" To God, and to each other.

BASED ON Ephesians 2:11-22 - Therefore, remember that at one time, you Gentiles in the flesh-the ones who are called "uncircumcised" by those called "the circumcised" (which is performed physically by human hands)—¹² remember that at that time you were separated from Christ, excluded from the citizenship of Israel, and foreigners to the covenants of the promise. You were without hope and without God in the world. ¹³But now in Christ Jesus, you who once were far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ.¹⁴ For he himself is our peace. He made the two groups one by destroying the wall of hostility that divided them ¹⁵ when he abolished the law of commandments and regulations in his flesh. He did this to create in himself one new person out of the two, in this way making peace. ¹⁶ And he did this to reconcile both to God in one body through the cross by putting the hostility to death in him. ¹⁷ He also came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near.¹⁸ For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit. ¹⁹ So then, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of God's household.²⁰ You have been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the Cornerstone.²¹In him the whole building is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord. ²² In him you too are being built together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit.

Dear flock of God at St Paul,

What do you think about your church? Is it special to you? If so, why? What would your answer sound like? "I like the...at St Paul," Or, "I remember when we..." Or, "St Paul is where we first..." Or, "I like it when we...at St Paul."

Memories and shared experiences accumulate with time. It's like that at home. It's like that with church, too.

Connecting to a church and being a part of it, is important from little on. Impressions are made; patterns are set. While not everyone might necessarily get to grow up in the same church all their life, God wants church to be woven into the entire fabric of our lives from start to finish. The reason? Church is where God reveals his grace and mercy to us and feeds us through Word and sacrament. Though honesty of preaching and teaching in sermons, Bible class and Sunday School, sinners are constantly turned in repentance and faith to Jesus, AND are equipped to follow Jesus and live for him as his disciples.

What do I think about my church? Better to ask, what does God tell me church is for? Even better: "What do I think about Jesus?" The church's constant mission is to point sinners to Jesus. God the Father wants his children to have a deep-down, meaningful relationship with his Son. As you and I stand before God, we know full well that we're covered in sin. Our first concern ought to be that, apart from Christ, we are objects of his wrath. Reflecting on our daily sin against God, the wretched exclaimed. "What a Apostle Paul man I am! Who will rescue me from this body that is subject to death?" (Rom.7:24) Which brings us back to the mission of the church: to turn sinners to Jesus by proclaiming the good news that Jesus has rescued us from sin and made us heirs of eternal life! The psalmist said, "With my mouth I will greatly extol the LORD; in the great throng of worshipers I will praise him." (Psalm 109:30) Continued next page...



COUNCIL SETS 10-YEAR PLEDGE AMOUNT TO FVLHS

The theme, "Let the Children Come" is guiding federation churches as we pledge our support to Fox Valley Lutheran High School's new building project.
