Welcome to Worship...

On this Second Sunday in Advent we hear John the Baptist coming to prepare the way for the coming Christ by preaching a message of repentance (Gospel Lesson). John is the *"voice of one calling in the wilderness,"* that Isaiah and Malachi wrote about (Old Testament Lesson), but it is Christ, and only Christ, who could carry out the hard service of suffering for our sin. Malachi sees him as a refiner's fire, a purifier of silver (v.3). The message today asks if anything in us needs purifying. Because he loves us, God tells us the truth about our impurities, and then he purifies us. To that person who says, "Not me! I'm pretty good," Malachi has a warning. "God is fire, and he's coming!" Believers will welcome and receive him. In Christ, they are even blessed in the refiner's fire, and they worship Him for it!







Who can stand when he appears? For he will be like a refiner's fire or a launderer's soap. 3 He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver; he will purify the Levites and refine them like gold and silver. Then the LORD will have men who will bring offerings in righteousness, 4 and the offerings of Judah and Jerusalem will be acceptable to the LORD, as in days gone by, as in former years.

SECOND LESSON: 1 CORINTHIANS 4:1-5 (Faithful messengers

LUKE 3:1-6 (John the Baptist preaches the need for repentance and forgiveness.) "In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of Iturea and Traconitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene—2 during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the desert. 3 He went into all the country around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. 4 As is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet: "A voice of one calling in the desert, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him. 5 Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill made low.
